






Plat of Road

Thomas and J. E. Long as chairmen and Henry Brown as ~~chairman~~ ^{ordman}, and J. C. Cooper (by J. R. Thomas, deputy) as surveyor of said County and after said chairman had been duly sworn proceeded to view and survey said proposed road as surveyed for in said petition as near as in our opinion a good road could be made at a reasonable expense, taking

into consideration the utility, convenience and incurrence and expense which will result to individuals as well as to the public if such road should be established, and said surveyor surveyed said proposed road under our direction and caused the same to be marked throughout noting the angles and distances and otherwise marking and surveying the same as by law provided and said surveyor made a plat of said proposed road as surveyed by him, which plat and survey ^{is hereto} attached and made a part hereof, and we further report that said proposed road should be opened established and located upon said application and we recommend that the prayer of petitioners be granted and that said road be located as prayed for in their petition and as surveyed by us and we further state that said road will be of public utility and convenience.

We further state that we are each entitled to 3 days, and that our chainmen are each entitled to 2 days, and that W. J. Rutch is entitled to one day extra in bringing in this report.
